WOMEN WHO CHANGED ITALY

This article features Italian women who changed Italy and the world. They have not always been recognized in written accounts, but their contributions are significant.

Trotula of Salerno (11th and 12th centuries)

Trotula of Salerno was a female physician who worked in Salerno, the epicenter of medieval medicine in Europe. Trotula was one of the most famous physicians of the time and a pioneer in women's health. She is considered the world's first gynecologist

Maria Gaetana Agnesi (1718 – 1799)



Agnesi is credited with writing the first book discussing both differential and integral calculus. She was an honorary member of the faculty at the University of Bologna. Some major mathematicians consider her the first important woman mathematician since Hypatia (a neoplatonist philosopher of the fifth century A.D. and the first notable woman in mathematics).

Maria Montessori (1870 – 1952)



Maria Montessori was a physician, humanitarian and educator, best known for the philosophy and system of education bearing her name. Montessori education is characterized by an emphasis on independence, freedom within limits, and respect for a child's natural psychological development. Montessori's ideas were well received internationally, and Montessori societies to promote her work were formed in many countries.

Rita Levi Montalcini (1909 – 2012)

Rita Levi-Montalcini was a neurologist and one of Italy's leading scientists who, together with biochemist Stanley Cohen, received the 1986 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine for their discovery of nerve growth factor (NGF). Their discovery is of fundamental importance to the understanding of cell and organ growth and plays a significant role in understanding cancers and diseases such as Alzheimer's and Parkinson's.

Laura Iris Ferro (1951 -)



Laura Iris Ferro was a practicing medical psychiatrist for 15 years and today one of the most promising Italian biotech entrepreneurs and innovators. She is the founder of Gentium S.p.A., a bio-pharmaceutical company specialized in the research, development and production of drugs for the treatment and prevention of diseases related to cancer and oncology treatments, the only Italian biotech company traded on the American stock exchange. The Wall Street Journal defined her as one of the 10 European women to watch.

Miuccia Prada (1949 -)

Trendsetting fashion legend Miuccia Prada runs the luxury goods and clothing company Prada founded by her grandfather Mario Prada in 1913. She was initially reluctant to follow in her grandfather's footsteps, but with her husband's support, she went on to create one of the world's greatest fashion empires, owning such brands as Fendi, Jil Sander, Azzedine Alaia and Helmut Lang. Today, the company 414 stores (of which 253 Prada stores) in 70 countries.
